Religiosity In Exercises 1–8, use the information below.



GDP is the market value of the goods and services produced by a country over a certain time period, usually by year. It is often used as a comparative statistic to gauge a country's standard of living.

- **2.** Describe the information presented in the graph.

- **4.** What is the dominant religion in France?
- **5.** Does the graph support the comment below? Explain your reasoning.
