Buying Generic Prescription Drugs

In the United States, prescription drugs are often expensive. You can usually save money by asking your doctor to prescribe a generic version of a drug. Here are some sample savings.

Condition	Monthly Cost for Brand-Name Drug	Monthly Cost for Generic Substitute	
High blood pressure	\$128	\$13	
High cholesterol	\$95	\$37	
Depression	\$103	\$37	
Arthritis pain	\$135	\$30	
Heartburn	\$179	\$24	

Which of these represents the greatest discount percent?

Crossing Borders for Prescription Drugs

Thousands of American seniors are going to Canada to stock up on something they can't seem to find at home—affordable prescription drugs.

Here are some examples. A stomach acid medication costs U\$\$129 in the US, but only U\$\$53 in Canada. An antihyperglycemic agent costs U\$\$52 in the US, but only U\$\$12 in Canada, Conjugated estrogens cost U\$\$26 in the US, but only U\$\$7 in Canada.
